3 Foes Of Personal Responsibility

- The 'rights' mentality: "I demand my rights."
- The 'victim' mentality: "It's not my fault."
- The 'entitlement' mentality: "I deserve it."

WHY LIVE RESPONSIBLY?

1. Because God Is Watching My Life.

"Nothing in all the world can be hidden from God. Everything is open before him, and to him we must explain the way we have lived." Heb. 4:13 (NCV)

"Each of us will have to give a personal account to God." Rom. 14:12 (NLT)

2. Because Others Are Affected By My Life.

"People should be concerned about others and not just about themselves." 1 Cor. 10:24 (GWT)

3. Because God Rewards It

"You will experience all God's blessings if you obey the Lord." Deut. 28:2 (NCV)

"To those who use well what they are given, even more will be given." Matt. 25:29 (NLT)

HOW CAN I DARE TO BE A MORE RESPONSIBLE PERSON?

1. By Controlling My Reaction

"A fool expresses all his emotions, but a wise person controls them." Prov. 29:11 (NCV)

2. By Admitting My Mistakes
